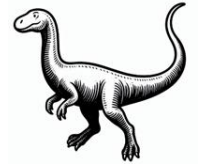

Dinosaur Country

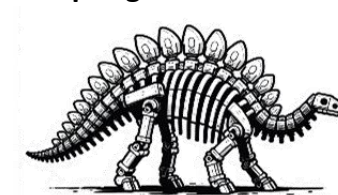

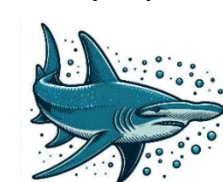
